



Celebrating the light.

I started seeing Christmas lights right after Halloween this year. It feels especially early to me. As a kid, I grew up in a family that decorated just a week or so before Christmas. But this year some people tell me they want to put up lights and their Christmas tree right now. One woman said she realized it's earlier than ever before—but it just seems like the right thing to do this year. It's as if people are responding to the heavy news of our time with a little bit of light. We know the hard news; there's war between Israel and Hamas—and the war between Ukraine and a Russian dictator keeps grinding on into another winter.

In a world like this people really need light.

The thing is what we need has got to be brighter than just Christmas lights and it has to last a whole lot longer than a Christmas tree. And that's where the Good News of Jesus meets us. He is light.

The light comes for us in Jesus most especially in the dark times—if you've ever had a "blue Christmas" you might remember how a little bit of Jesus' light helped you to hold on to a better day.

I believe Jesus is the Light this world needs—and Christmas is all about the light coming and shining bright even in dark times. John started his Gospel, his story about Jesus, talking about the light of God coming into the world.

John 1:4-5 (NRSV)

⁴ in him was life,^a and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There's a promise to hold onto. Light has come for all people. Hope has come for me and all the world.

10 Minute Bible Study: John 1

The Gospel of John starts out with a poem about Jesus. John doesn't tell a Christmas story about shepherds and angels. He starts out talking about light that had come into the world. John knew exactly what the world needed and he knew he had known the light--and John wanted to share that peace that he had from knowing the light of Jesus.

Read John 1:1-2

John didn't call his savior by the name Jesus to start. John called Jesus the Word. And John had a whole lot to say about every place that Jesus, the Word, had already been. What does it mean to hear John say Jesus was with God in the very beginning?

Read John 1:3-5

John knew Jesus as a flesh and blood man. But he also knew Jesus as the one who was they were at the creation part of everything that was made. According to John Jesus is light for all the world.

What does it mean to you this year to hear the promise that God's love keeps shining in Jesus?

Read John 1:6-8

Many other people who were going to be part of the story of God coming into the world. Some people confused the messenger sent to prepare the way with the Light who was really coming.

How are we as Jesus people today called to help make the world ready for the light of Jesus?

Read John 1:9-13

Jesus people live in a brand new name, John says we are "children of the Light". What does it mean to be a child of God in this age?

Read John 1:14

When Jesus stepped into our life people could see God's glory for the first time and flesh and blood. He lived here, was part of a family, had brothers and sisters, he was God right with us. But some people didn't see it.

How do you see Jesus at work in the world this year as Christmas comes near?




