Pastor's Column

This year Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are the same day Wednesday, February 14, 2024. Combining these two very different days has gotten me thinking about love. There are some very real and different definitions of love.

Valentine's Day celebrates one kind of love—romance and all the passion that goes with it.

Valentines seems tailor made for selling greeting cards and roses by the dozen.

Ash Wednesday is all about God's love for imperfect people. In so many ways the heart of Ash Wednesday is remembering that we can come to God as is needing his transforming love.

Putting Ash Wednesday and Valentines together can challenge us to talk about all the full power of love. When we talk about love we start to see how God's love and our love can be so very different. Looking at Valentines roses on Ash Wednesday might help you expand the meaning of love. On Valentine's Day romance and sentimentality flow so easily but Ash Wednesday reminds us that there's so much more to love than flowers and heart shaped candy boxes.

With so much "love" talk maybe it's a good time as church to think about some of Jesus' most challenging words about love. Jesus talked about love for all people—even love for our enemies. Jesus said,

²⁷ "But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. ²⁹ If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. ³⁰ Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. ³¹ Do to others as you would have them do to you. Luke 6:27-31 (NRSV)

Jesus' words about love enlighten and challenge us. Jesus' words about loving our enemies pushes us far past our sentimental definitions of love. There's a place for love and romance—but Jesus invites us to go past the romance to a love that gives without expectation.

Jesus words about loving our enemies challenge us. Love and compassion come easily for lovable people. But Jesus' says love everyone even our enemies.

A couple years back I was leading a worship service/bible study in a county jail. We were talking about Jesus definitions of love. The men were eager to joke about love. The men all nodded in agreement when I said it's easy to care for people who love us back. Then I asked what the "golden rule" had to do with love. I walked into that room with a definition of the golden rule in my mind. One man on the other side of the table said, "I know the golden rule—the one with the gold makes all the rules." The other men laughed. His "golden rule" is simple—but it's so different Jesus' teaching.

Jesus said it so simply,

Do to others as you would have them do to you. Luke 6:31 NRSV These words sound like good advice for us in our most cherished relationships—but Jesus wasn't just talking just about our relationships with close family and friends. Jesus is giving us an ethic, a way of life, that is shaped by concern for the well-being of all people. He is talking about the hard relationships even with people who misuse and mistreat.

Jesus talked a whole lot about love—love for God and love for people. He challenged his followers to love each other and even to love their enemies.

Look up Luke 6:27-36

How could Jesus call to love our enemies change this world?


